Kindergarten Registration Continues ...

All <u>new</u> Junior and Senior Kindergarten-aged students need to be registered as soon as possible for our September 2023 classes. (Students currently in our Kindergarten classes do not need to re-register.) If your son or daughter will be 4 or 5 years of age by December 31, 2023, please visit the school or DSBN website for the Kindergarten registration link. Registration can be completed online. If you know of neighbouring children who are eligible to begin school, please pass this information on to them.

As we plan for our 2023-2024 class organization, it is important for us to know if any students will not be returning to Lakeview, or if there are new families moving into our area. This information will assist us in our planning for September by minimizing surprises and disruptions for class organization.

When we form classes, a great deal of consideration goes into the placement of students to provide the best possible academic and social environment. Some of the factors considered include: social maturity, organizational skills, learning style, ability to work independently, academic ability, class dynamics as well as attitude toward and commitment to school work. We all want what is best for the children at Lakeview School. We do expect to have a number of split classes next year. Every year, we receive numerous requests from parents to keep their child in a straight grade class rather than a split. These requests will not be considered.

If you have a specific request about your child's placement for the coming school year, please submit it by email to lav@dsbn.org by Friday, May 12th. Parental requests will be considered in conjunction with the factors listed above, although we cannot guarantee that requested placements will be fulfilled. Our goal is to provide a learning environment in which all of our students will be most successful.

In-person Scholastic Book Fair



Accessible Parking at Lakeview

Did you know that 1 in 7 people in Ontario have some form of disability?

No matter what type of disability, these individuals are eligible to accessible parking spaces. Often they come across situations when an accessible parking space is occupied by someone without an Accessible Parking Permit, or when the access aisle, the striped area beside the parking space, is blocked by an adjacent car.

How you can help?

Show that you #RespectTheSpace by being mindful of accessible parking spaces and do not park in an accessible parking space without a valid permit.

Review of Arrival & Dismissal Procedures

As you are aware, school zones and parking lots are **VERY** congested during arrival and dismissal times so it is imperative that we have safety procedures in place. We appreciate your cooperation in helping to ensure the safety of every person during these busy times. The following procedures are in place:

- 1. No students will be permitted in the parking lot without an adult. Please do not ask your child to meet you at your vehicle unless you are using the Kiss & Ride lane.
- 2. In the morning, if you enter the back parking lot between 8:45 and 9:00 a.m., you will be directed into the Kiss & Ride lane and will have to wait in line to leave the parking lot area. If you arrive after 9:00 a.m., the Kiss & Ride gate will be closed and you will need to drive your child around to the front doors of the school.
- 3. There is very limited parking available at the school. Please park in designated spots only. The area along the west side of driveway to the parking lot is NOT a parking area.
- 4. There are only two handicapped parking spots that must remain available for members of our school community who have permits.
- 5. Staff are out on duty at 8:45 a.m. so you can drop your child off and carry on with your day. If you are dropping your student off, please use our Kiss & Ride lane. There will be 3 drop-off spaces in front of the entrance gate. Please remain in line and follow the directions of the staff. Be sure that your children are ready to hop out of the car when you stop so that you do not hold up traffic in the parking lot. It is safest if children exit your vehicle on the passenger side only.
- 6. Children who walk to school should cross with the crossing guard and follow the sidewalk around to the back of the school. Students should not be using the front doors to enter the school unless they are late.
- 7. Please allow your children to go to the school yard by themselves. This is an excellent opportunity for them to develop independence and confidence. Children will be dismissed through their regular doors at the end of each day so that they may meet younger siblings or you, the parents, in front of the school.
- 8. Please note that **supervision begins at 8:45 a.m.** in the morning. Students should not be arriving at school prior to supervision time.

We strongly encourage families to walk to school together rather than drive or use the bus provided. This will save gas, improve fitness rates and will help to protect the environment, but most importantly, will be a safer mode of travel for our students.



CROSSING WITH THE CROSSING GUARD SAFELY

At Lakeview Public School, we work closely with our community partners and value our work with the Town of Grimsby. The Town is responsible for the placement of Crossing Guards, as well as providing a replacement when necessary. With the nicer weather ahead, more students will be walking or riding their bikes to school. Below are some reminders from the Town of Grimsby to ensure student safety when crossing with the Crossing Guard.

To enhance safe and active travel to school in our community, we strongly encourage our school families to use the services of the School Crossing Guards provided. Choosing safety over convenience is a positive life lesson to share with our students and we rely on both adults and older students to help set the example for positive and safe pedestrian habits for our younger community members. The added value of School Crossing Guards at key crossing locations, is the addition of the necessary 'adult judgment' to help ascertain weather conditions, road conditions, distance and speed, gaps in traffic, turning traffic, distracted driving and so much more.

While waiting to cross the roadway, always stand 2-3 large steps back from the roadway. When crossing with the Guard, we ask that you dismount your bicycles and scooters and walk them across the crosswalk. Hold onto all sports equipment, remove headphones/earbuds and pause phone conversations, allowing your sole focus to be roadway safety.

Wait for the Guard to indicate it is safe to cross the roadway once he/she is assured the traffic has stopped. Do not follow the Guard directly onto the roadway. Always walk across the road and no horseplay while crossing. If crossing at a pedestrian walk signal, do not enter the crosswalk once the flashing hand has appeared. Wait for the next walk signal.

Please keep in mind that School Crossing Guards are out there serving their communities, under all weather conditions and need everyone to follow the laws applicable under the Highway Traffic Act. Be mindful of their safety and the safety of their pedestrians!
